

Program Impacts

ANR Impact

- 11 area residents began the Texas Master Naturalist certificate training program. On average, Texas Master Naturalist across the state volunteer 350,000 hours of service to the state of Texas. The TMN panhandle chapter averages 4,800 volunteer hours per year.
- The 4-H Vet Science kids participate in a clinical lab with veterinarian. Kids were exposed to sedation and castration of show hogs. The kids had one-on-one time with a local vet and learned a great deal!
- Demonstration gardens were planted in preparation of the Tri-State Fair. Two areas on the Tri-State Fairgrounds are dedicated to educating attendees of the fair about low-water-use landscapes and ag. commodities grown in the Texas panhandle.



4-H Impact

- Potter County had 35 participants in Big Fun in D1 and other district contests, including; Livestock Judging, Consumer Decision Making, Horse Judging, Duds to Dazzle, Educational Presentation, Archery, and Rifle. Two Teams advanced to compete at Roundup.
- As Amarillo began wrapping up the 2020-2021 school year we were able to supplement some instruction time at four elementary schools. We reached 208 students as we taught them about healthy habits for the summer and how to make and launch bottle rockets.
- 9 Senior level 4-H members participated in 4 contests at Texas 4-H Roundup in College Station. The FCH Quiz Bowl team was 7th and the Livestock Judging Team was 19th out of 41 teams!
- 3 youth competed at the District 1 Horse show. All youth brought home many awards and prizes in their categories.
- 4 youth attended the District Leadership Camps. The seniors participated in a community service project, learned about electricity and power from Xcel Energy, gained new leadership skills, and made new friendships. The juniors were able to participate in leadership activities, a 4-H Quiz Bowl, STEM project, and make valuable connections with their peers.





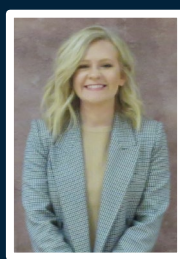

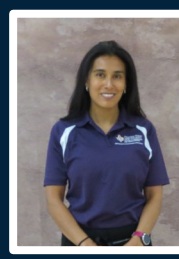

PVAMU Impact

- Duds to Dazzle program offered for the first time at Maverick Boys & Girls Club focuses on making a viable product by recycling a textile that no longer serves its original purpose.
- Participants in the program are close to 90% minority.
- Ninety-seven percent of the students have never sewn before.
- "I didn't think I could sew before this class. It's fun, and I'm excited I can make stuff!"





FCH Impact

- Financial Stability 18 completed Dave Ramsey Financial Peace and built a solid foundation for long term personal financial wellness. 720 received financial literacy information and resources through educational newsletters to reinforce goals to achieve financial security.
- District 1 Early Childhood Conference 29 Early Childhood Providers received early childhood educational training hours to improve quality care & increased knowledge for safe, engaging, and inclusive settings to include literacy, active shooter response and special needs inclusion.
- Health Talk Express 18 participants attended Health Talk Express series to take action and empowerment on chronic disease prevention. Participants increased awareness on chronic disease prevention to include diabetes, high cholesterol, stress management, and physical activity.
- Mental Health First Aid 4 Master Wellness Volunteers received 8 hours of Mental Health First Aid Certification Training. Received skills needed for MWV's to reach out and provide initial support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem and help connect them to the appropriate care and resources.
