#### 4-H & Youth Development:

- 37 entries in 10 Spring Big Fun in D1 Contests.
- 13 4-H members competed in 5 contests at Texas 4-H Roundup.
- 1 member presented a speech at the Roundup Kickoff event and was elected to serve on the Texas 4-H Council in 2023-2024.
- 7 4-H Members attended Senior
   Power camp and Junior
   Leadership Camp.



### **Agriculture & Natural Resources:**

- Potter Ag. assisted the North Heights Community Association with planning and planting a community garden. The garden will provide fresh produce for lowincome families in Amarillo.
- Potter Ag. assists NRCS/USDA with burn assessments for producers affected by an 8,000 acre burn in the county.
- Potter Ag. coordinated over \$2,100 of feed supply donations for producers who had cattle and horses standing in water for several weeks due to flooding in Valle De Oro.



### **IMPACTS**

- Potter/Randall 4th grade Ag Fair. 685 students from the Amarillo area attended the event to learn more about agriculture and farm safety.
- Potter Ag. provided over \$5,000 in donations & volunteer hours, to assist county residents affected by natural disasters in the county this spring.
- ▶ Health Talk Express empowered 128 adults to Go-4-30 and adopt empowering physical activity practices for an active lifestyle.

#### **Prairie View Cooperative Extension Program**

- Prairie View A&M University's
   Cooperative Extension Program and
   College of Agriculture and Human
   Sciences recently visited Potter
   County.
- They observed and learned about the Limited English Proficiency program area.
- They visited organizations and met many people who serve our refugee communities.



#### **Better Living for Texans**

- Nourishing Healthy Communities program presented in partnership with Sharing Hope Ministry. Education was presented on how to choose an optimal garden location, soils and compost, planting raised beds or container gardens, maintaining your garden, disease & insects, and harvesting.
- An average of 15 participants attended a monthly Lunch & Learn series from Fresh Start to a Healthier You!. Participants learned "Creating Safe & Healthier Meals", "Balancing Your Day", "Saving More at the Grocery Store", and "Celebrating Small Bites."



75 participants attended "Thinking Differently: Art & Mental Wellness" held in collaboration with Panhandle Behavioral Health Alliance. Attendees were instructed that although the benefits of gardening include increasing fruit & vegetable intake as well as providing food security, gardening also improves quality of life in that plants enhance mental health and a person's overall outlook. Participants created a planter with a living plant to take home discovering that active gardening provides positive energy & vitality, helps distract the mind, offers a sense of accomplishment, pride & ownership and builds self esteem.







## April — June 2023 **County Interpretation**



#### **Family & Community Health**

- 18 engaged in WAT's Cooking program to reinforce WAT goals, increase healthy cooking skills, gain nutrition knowledge & apply recipe demos to enhance health and chronic disease prevention.
- WAT Worksite Wellness Initiative empowered 114 Texas Panhandle Centers employees to focus on mental health awareness by increasing physical activity and walking 24, 753 miles.
- **38 parents and children** engaged in FRED Families Reading Every Day to reinforce family literacy & health living goals and together they read 391.5 hours.
- **32 individuals** received car seat safety checks and car seat replacements to reduce deaths and injuries and emphasize correct use of child safety seats.
